Main Points

Discussion Questions

1. What is the visual lesson of the city of Bethsaida the Rabbi referred too?
How striking is it that this city was the birth place of Peter, Andrew, James, John and Phillip, as well as the setting for the miracle of the feeding of the 5000? Jesus compared it as more tolerable for Sodom and Gomorrah than Bethsaida because Bethsaida rejected Jesus.

2. How should we appropriate this in our lives? What happens if we abandon our relationship with Him? Are you drawing from the well of relationship with Jesus on a daily basis? What is hindering you from you it? What can you do to remove those hindrances?

3. How did Paul show God's heart and his own heart toward the salvation of the people of Israel? (Romans 9-11) Has God rejected Jewish people because of their unbelief? Has He replaced them with the Church?

4. Are you showing love and support for Israel? What are some things you are doing to show your love and support? Your support of Discovering the Jewish Jesus is one way you do that.
Consider the two sides of the coin the Rabbi talked about. First, God is using we who are Gentiles to spur His people the Jews on to salvation, through jealousy. Secondly, that we are in no way behind the Jews, in embracing the Gospel which all must do to inherit eternal life. Do you find your love for Israel growing as you consider God's love for His people.
