Main Points

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Discussion Questions

1. The God who was David's shepherd is also our shepherd. Our faith in Him as a rewarder of those who seek Him is what allows us to experience Him in these ways. Have you seen Him and do you trust Him to be your shepherd? What stops you?
2. The covenant names Rabbi is teaching about are promises from Him that He will be that to all those who are in covenant with Him. What would it mean to you to KNOW that what God did for David He will do for you? As Rabbi explained, these are actual, real things He will do for you. How can you begin to tie your prayer life and sink your faith into the specific statements of Psalm 23?
3. What are some areas of your soul that need restoration? Isn't it comforting to know that His ministry is to the brokenhearted and his promise toward those who need healing in their souls? Write a prayer of agreement with Him about this area in your life.
4. The Rabbi correlated God's guidance of us to the bumpers children use in bowling. He keeps us moving forward and takes responsibility for the final outcome of getting us along the right pathways. Does this help you relax in your journey? How so?
