Main Points

- God's anointing falls most heavily where there's unity.

- Feelings are made to be subjected to our mind.
- Holiness means to be set apart.
- The English name (God) in Hebrew is HaShem
- Bless the Name (English) is Baruch HaShem in Hebrew.
- To be holy means to be different.
- Self-examination is one of the keys to sanctification.
- Don't ever stop talking to God.

Discussion Questions
