## Main Points

- God’s Holy Seasons include both the Spring Holy Days and the Fall Holy Days.
- The Fall Holy Days are considered the most holy days on the Jewish calendar.
- Whether you are a Jew or Gentile, the Holy Days have application for you.
- God wants to communicate something special to you during these holy days.
- Miqra-rehearsal
- Holy Day Application Perspective have both historical context and prophetic foreshadow-(what has been will also be.)
- **Rosh Hashanah** is also known as the Feast of Trumpets or Yom Teruah.
- Rosh Hashanah means “head of the year.”
- Rosh Hashanah 2018 begins at sunset on Sunday, September 9<sup>th</sup> and ends at nightfall on Tuesday, September 11<sup>th</sup>.
- Holy Day Application: The blowing of the trumpet symbolizes the rapture.
- The trumpet sound is a reminder of when the Israelites encountered God.
- L’Shanah Tova means “Happy New Year!”
- **Yom Kippur**- The Day of Atonement
- Rosh Hashanah begins the 10 Days of Awe-a time of year where people prepare to be judged on the Day of Atonement.
- Yom Kippur/Day of Atonement 2018-Yom Kippur begins at sunset on Tuesday, September 18<sup>th</sup> and ends at nightfall on Wednesday, September 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Holy Day Application: The 10 Days of Awe is a season of repentance.
- Open yourself up to the Holy Spirit.
- God is continually cleansing us and bringing us deeper.



## Discussion Questions

1. God's appointed holy days are a rehearsal for future fulfillment in God's relationship with His people, whether Jewish or Gentile believers. What is the future prophetic fulfillment of the Feast of Trumpets?
2. The days between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur are days of a season of repentance. Why did the people of God need this leading up to Yom Kippur? What should be our fulfillment of these days of Awe?
3. Rabbi encourages you to spend appointed time with Father God to examine our life and seek repentance and correction from Him. Do you feel freedom to do this or do you feel apprehensive and fearfulness? Take time right now to write about why this might be so. Begin recording the things God shows you as you surrender to His presence.
