Main Points

- Jesus is our first fruits
 - o He arose from the dead on First Fruits!
 - By doing so, and ascending to the Father, we have been made Holy and acceptable to the LORD.
- Jesus is alive; the same yesterday, today and forever!
 - o We worship a present and living God
 - o He is the same Jesus that we read about in the New Testament
- Jesus bore our sickness as well as our transgression on the cross
 - o By His stripes, we are healed.
