Main Points

- One way we fix our eyes on the Spirit is by fixing our eyes on the Word of God.
- The Spirit of God inhabits those who know Him and love Him.

- The cross represents dying to oneself and doing the Father's will.
- Death represents the fear of the unknown.
- Death represents the fear of being out of control.
- God wants us to know that when we leave this world, we are going to go be with Him.
