#### Main Points

- Jesus saw Himself as the one who came to complete that which God revealed in the Hebrew Scriptures.
- A Christian is one who is following the Anointed One.
- God is Supernatural!
- Jesus is the fulfillment of Judaism.
- Without Jesus, Judaism is incomplete.
- Jesus is the aim to which the Hebrew Scriptures spoke of.
- Anybody that is actively following Jesus is a Christian.
- Jesus' Jewish History
  - Born King of the Jews
  - Raised by practicing Jewish parents.
  - Celebrated Passover every year.
  - $\circ$  Circumcised on the 8<sup>th</sup> day.
  - Chose 12 Jews to be His Apostles.
  - Ministered only to Jewish people.
  - Crucified as King of the Jews.
  - Sent Holy Spirit on the Jewish feast Shavuot.
  - Sits in Heaven as the Lion of Judah.
  - Coming back as the offspring of David.
- Gentile believers should not separate their faith in Jesus from a Judaic context.
