## *The Holy of Holies*



### Scriptures

- Revelation 1:4
- Numbers 17
- Exodus 16
- Joshua 5:12
- Acts 2:3

### Main Points

#### **From the Replica of the Tabernacle in Southern Israel**

- Golden Menorah-represents the Holy Spirit
- The Table of Showbread
- The 12 loaves of bread stand for God's presence with and eyes upon the 12 tribes of Israel.
- Altar of Incense-prayers of God's people arise straight up to God.
- High Priest
  - white undergarment represents purity
  - blue outer garment to represent heaven
  - breastplate with 12 stones representing the 12 tribes of Israel
  - shoulders list the tribes
  - miter or cap says "Holy to the Lord"
  - Bells and pomegranates hanging from the skirt of the blue garment
    - Bells-preaching God's Word.
    - Pomegranates-the fruit of the Spirit seen in the life actions.
- We cannot preach the Word without having the fruit of the Spirit in our lives.
- The curtain represents spiritual warfare.
- We need to learn how to do spiritual warfare to enter in to where God's glory is.
- The Holy of Holies
  - The Ten Commandments-proof of God's moral make up and character
  - Aaron's rod that budded-proof of God's leading through Moses and Aaron
  - Omar of manna-proof of God's supernatural and natural daily provision
- The Holy of Holies teaches us principles that must be operating in our lives for God to dwell with us.
- If we want to go deep with God, we need to contend for the supernatural in our lives.
- The Ark of the Covenant-God's shekinah glory between the cherubim and seraphim
- The Law contains the self-revelation of who God is.
- The law represents God's divine nature and His moral attributes.
- God has made a way for you into the Holy of Holies.
