How to Interpret Your Dreams



Scripture

- **Daniel 2:25-28**

Then Arioch hurriedly brought Daniel into the king's presence and spoke to him as follows: "I have found a man among the exiles from Judah who can make the interpretation known to the king!" The king said to Daniel, whose name was Belteshazzar, "Are you able to make known to me the dream which I have seen and its interpretation?" Daniel answered before the king and said, "As for the mystery about which the king has inquired, neither wise men, conjurers, magicians nor diviners are able to declare it to the king. However, there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries, and He has made known to King Nebuchadnezzar what will take place in the latter days. This was your dream and the visions in your mind while on your bed."

Main Points

- Not every dream is from the Lord.
- God speaks to His children in their dreams at night.
- We should expect to receive communication from our Father through our dreams at night.
- Most dreams come to us in symbolic language.
- The same One who gave you the dream will also give you the interpretation as you look to Him prayerfully for the interpretation.
- God will give you the interpretation to your dream.
- God will give us direction through our dreams.
- Believe that God does speak in dreams today, and He will speak to you.
- Dreams are for the purpose of Father and Jesus communicating to you and I individually.
- Start the day slow; give yourself time to spend with the Lord.
- The more you practice seeking to recall your dreams, the more you will remember.
- Pray for revelation from God.
- Review your dream journal from time to time.
- To disregard your dreams is to disregard God.

Discussion Questions

1. When God gives you a dream, how can you get its interpretation? What is your part in finding out the interpretation? Is it good to talk it over with people? Is your first understanding of the dream always correct?
2. What kinds of things can God reveal in our dreams?
3. What are the steps that Rabbi outlined toward receiving from our dreams?
4. Why is it important to know dreams are not gifts in the sense of spiritual gifts outlined in Corinthians? What purpose do dreams serve?
5. If you typically don't remember your dreams, what did Rabbi suggest?
6. Are you willing to do what is necessary to hear from God in your dreams?
