## Main Points

- The English word Exodus is transliterated in Hebrew as Shemot.
- Israel is a symbol of the Church (both Jew and Gentile).
- Egypt is a symbol of the World.
- Pharaoh is a symbolic representation of Satan.
- Passover is sometimes referred to as the Festival of Freedom.
- Do you have a vision of freedom?
- STEPS TO FREEDOM:
  - Believe that God has something more for you.
  - We need to repent.
- The Lord will drive out your enemies little by little.
- God is calling us to be on the journey **towards** perfection.
- The Lamb of God is enough.
- Jesus is enough to satisfy every real need we have in life.
- Jesus is enough:
  - To sustain us physically.

- Hebrew: Yahweh Rapha
    - English: The LORD who heals.
    - God wants us to rely on Him for every single need we have.
  - To satisfy our souls.
  - Because He is coming back.
- Rabbi's Prayer: *"Jesus, I love you. Yeshua, You're my Messiah. I am waiting for You, O Lamb of God, to return. And I want to prepare myself and make myself ready to see You face to face. Thank you for loving me and I ask You to continue, King Jesus, to work in my life, that I'll be able to stand before You, O beautiful and precious lamb of God, holy and prepared to be Your bride."*

## Discussion Questions

1. What is the foundational Biblical event for interpreting the end time events and why is this reasonable?
2. What symbolism is present and what does each element symbolize?
3. Who or what is oppressing us in these days? Is true freedom possible? Do you have a vision for freedom? Write what God is directing you to consider.
4. What are the steps to freedom? Write how this applies to the areas of your struggle.
5. Can you expect freedom to be immediate? Why or why not?
6. In what ways is Jesus enough? Are you really trusting Him for these things?
7. Consider the return of our Lord. Are you prepared and ready to meet Him? Did you pray the prayer Rabbi prayed? It is written above. Take some personal time to pray this prayer and write your guidance from the Holy Spirit in answer.
