Main Points

- When you are moving forward in your faith, the enemy will respond by attacking you.
- Spiritual attacks:
 - 1. Recognize that you are being attacked.
 - \circ 2. Enter your spiritual stronghold.
- Pentecost Acts 2 and Shavuot Exodus 34
- During Pentecost, God gave a supernatural gift to speak to others in a different, **real** language.
- When believers are given a supernatural gift to speak a different tongue, it is usually not a known language, but instead a **prayer** language.
- Gift of Tongues:
 - 1) Ability to speak in a known language you have never learned.

- 2) Ability to speak in a supernatural language, to be used in a corporate gathering with an interpreter.
- 3) Ability to speak in a supernatural language, that is for the benefit of the **believer.**
- The gift of tongues as a prayer language is available for all believers.
- A **prayer language** is the burden of your soul being released by the Holy Spirit so you can connect with God in a very deep and real way.
- During Spiritual Attacks:
 - 1) Can go into a stronghold by using your prayer language.
 - 2) Can go into a stronghold by being still and quiet while alone before God.
- The Hebrew transliterated word D'vekut in English means "to cling to something."

Discussion Questions

- 1. What is the response of the enemy when we are moving forward in God?
- 2. What does resistance to the enemy and clinging to God do for us? How did Jesus experience this? David?
- 3. What were the tongues in Acts 2 all about? Were they real languages?
- 4. What about tongues used in a corporate gathering? What is needed for this to be used?
- 5. Concerning a personal prayer language, for whose benefit does this occur? Who can make use of this and for what purpose?
- 6. What is the stronghold you can enter when under attack? What can getting in a place of quiet surrender and trust, utilizing your prayer language, bring to you in the pressure of battle with the enemy? Write about an experience you have had in this area.
