Main Points

- God uses everything in our life to conform us to the image of Jesus.
- God had a destiny for you before you were even born.
- God's purpose for your life is to be conformed to the image of His Son.
- God uses difficulties to conform us to the image of Jesus.
- Because you were chosen, you were predestined and called.
- When you entered into a relationship with Jesus, you became **justified.**
- We are not justified because of who we are, but because we are in Jesus.

- God will never love you and I more than He loves us right now.
- IN CHRIST YOU ARE: chosen, predestined, justified, called, and glorified.
- We are so much more than we realize.
- You are going to be glorified!
- God has a plan, a future, and a destiny for us!
