Main Points

- Prayer is about creating that connection between our Creator and ourselves so we can live in our destiny.
- We have been called to receive the gift of eternal life.
- Prayer is about entering into a state of knowing God.
- Kishkas is a Yiddish word meaning "deepest parts of our insides".
- Authentic prayer is being concerned about what God wants for you.
- We can be satisfied!
- The goal of our prayer should be that we would know God.
- Authentic Prayer happens when we transition to wanting the deeper things of God.

- Authentic Prayer is about questing after the real things.
- Authentic Prayer is about desiring the things that God desires for you.
- Authentic Prayer begins with a humble heart.
- The Hebrew word Mishkan in English is the Tabernacle.
- True Authentic Prayer ascends straight up to God.
