#### Scripture

#### • Romans 8:31

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things? Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies; who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? Just as it is written, "For your sake we are being put to death all day long; We were considered as sheep to be slaughtered." But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

#### Main Points

- The Creator of all things chose you!
- You are God's elect.

- He will be present in your future, so there is nothing to worry about.
- Say, "Yes Father, I am going to trust You."
- Let's make it our ambition to lead a carefree life because we trust God.
- Nothing is going to prevent the Father's love!
- He is going to be sufficient for you every day of your life.

## Discussion Questions

1.	If you are God's chosen and elect, who has any power over you?
2.	What dear gift was God willing to give to you? Why would He ever spare giving you anything else? Take a moment to process this through prayer to God your Father.
3.	In what ways has God has met your needs in the past? Is He meeting your needs in the present? Will He be present in your future? Will He not be faithful then as He is now and was in the past? What should this do to our tendency to worry?
4.	How will you remind yourself in the future that Jesus is with you? If you have not, commit these verses to memory for that very purpose.
5.	Rabbi described unbelief and fear as foul spirits. Can you commit today to lead a carefree life? Do it now! In your journaling, keep a record of your experiences with this.
6.	Can anything stop God's love from ministering to you? Has God promised a life void of hardship? What did Paul say? How should we respond?
7.	Can you pray the prayer of repentance with Rabbi concerning saying yes to believing God's promises in Romans chapter 8?
