- Sh'ma Yisra'eil Adonai Eloheinu Adonai Echad is the The Shema (Deuteronomy 6:4) In English, Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD is one!
- It is your imperfections and your brokenness that become your potential quality for greatness.
- Your imperfection is your starting point.

- Your mission is to overcome!
- ***Revelations to Set you Free:***
 - Your imperfection is what qualifies you for greatness.
 - We have to recognize how close He is.
- You will overcome. You will be made strong. God's power will be made perfect in your weakness. You will have a great reward.
- Ruach HaKodesh is the Hebrew word for the Holy Spirit.
