Main Points

- Anything you will ever face, you will overcome, because you are in Jesus, who was raised from the dead.
- Biblical faith understands that what we are living for is the inheritance that is reserved in Heaven for us.
- Our focus should be what we are going to receive when we see Him face to face.

- We should be focusing on the fact that we are walking in fellowship and in union with the Father.
- As we keep being faithful, over the years, you are going deeper in the love of God and coming into a greater experiential walk with the Father.
