Scripture

• Leviticus 23:39-43

'On exactly the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the crops of the land, you shall celebrate the feast of the LORD for seven days. Now on the first day you shall take for yourselves the foliage of beautiful trees, palm branches and boughs of leafy trees and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the LORD your God for seven days. Thus, celebrate it as a feast to the LORD...It shall be a perpetual statute...'

4²You shall live in booths for seven days; all the native-born in Israel shall live in booths, so that your generations may know that I had the sons of Israel live in booths when I brought them out from the land of Egypt. I am the LORD your God.'

• <u>Deuteronomy 8:2-5-17</u>

"You shall remember all the way which the LORD your God has led you in the wilderness these forty years, that He might humble you, testing you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not. He humbled you and let you be hungry and fed you with manna which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that He might make you understand that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by everything that proceeds out of the mouth of the LORD. Thus, you are to know in your heart that the LORD your God was disciplining you just as a man disciplines his son. For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing forth in valleys and hills; When you have eaten and are satisfied, you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land which He has given you. He led you through the great and terrible wilderness, with its fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water; He brought water for you out of the rock. In the wilderness He fed you manna...Otherwise you may say in your heart, 'My power and the strength of my hand made me this wealth.""

Main Points

- The Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot) sunset to sunset, Sunday, Oct 9th-Oct. 16th, 2022.
- Rosh Hashanah (Yom Teruah) is a time of self examination when the Kingdom of God is announced.
- Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) is a celebration that God's blood has cleansed us from sin.
- Sukkot (Feast of Tabernacles) is a time of rejoicing and thanking God for everything He has done.
- The Feast of Tabernacles was a time of harvest, thanksgiving and celebrating all good things.
- The Feast of Tabernacles is a time to be thankful for everything that God has done.
- Don't look at what you don't have. Be thankful for what you do have.
- A truly wealthy person is an individual that has cultivated an attitude of thanksgiving and gratitude for what they do have.
- Celebrate and rejoice!
- God is a happy God!
- Rejoice continually, and you will overcome every obstacle.
- Continually rejoice and always be thankful!
- When you are in the midst of a trial, know that God is with you in the midst of your wilderness.
- The reason God brings us through trials is because He wants to fully bless us.
- Remember that you are blessed because God is blessing you.
