Scripture

• <u>Leviticus 23: 16</u>

"You shall count fifty days to the day after the seventh sabbath; then you shall present a new grain offering to the Lord.

• <u>Acts 2: 1-6, 15-18</u>

1When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place and suddenly there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance. Now there were Jews living in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven. And when this sound occurred, the crowd came together, and were bewildered because each one of them was hearing them speak in his own language.

Main Points

- On the Greco-Roman calendar, Pentecost is Sunday, May 28th, 2023.
- The Hebrew word Moadim in English means appointed times, feasts.
- The Hebrew word Vayikra in English means Leviticus.
- Jesus was crucified on Passover.
- Jesus was buried during Unleavened Bread.
- Jesus rose from the dead on First Fruits.
- Shavuot or Feast of Weeks (Pentecost)
- Pentecost took place 7 weeks and a day (50 days) after Passover.
- In Greek, Pentecost means 50.
- In Hebrew, Shemot means Exodus. Mishkan means Tabernacle.
- When we are submitted to Yeshua's word, a covering comes over our lives, and we become a place where the presence of the Lord can rest.
- The Torah refers to the first five books of the Old Testament, also referred to as the Pentateuch.
- Pentecost had been celebrated for 1,500 years by Israel before Acts 2.
- Pentecost is rooted in the Torah in Leviticus 23:16.
- Pentecost is about God fulfilling that which He had given the Hebrew people.
- We should be open to, expect, and pray for SUDDENLY moments with God!
- The New Testament is rooted and grounded in the Hebrew Bible.

Discussion Questions

- 1. What is the last of the "appointed days" in the Spring feasts? Describe when this feast takes place.
- 2. What Old Testament (Torah) event was the beginning of this feast and what were the disciples in Acts 2 thinking about as they were gathered together in the upper room? What did God do there that He did in the Torah accounts?
- 3. Have you ever experienced a "SUDDENLY" moment with God? Write about it. If not, are you open to such a moment?
- 4. What does this moment in the upper room help us to understand about the Old Testament and New Testament connection? (John 4:22; Joel 2:28)
- 5. What is true about the tongues heard in Acts 2? Were they prayer language or real language? Explain how we know.
- 6. Jeremiah 31 and Ezekial 36 reveal the meaning of this event. What gift have we also been given as part of the New Covenant? Describe what this means to you!
