Mysteries of the Song of Songs Season 5: Christ's Bride and Solomon's Couch



Scripture

• Song of Solomon 3:6-8-11; 4:1

"What is this coming up from the wilderness Like columns of smoke, Perfumed with myrrh and frankincense, with all scented powders of the merchant? Behold, it is the traveling couch of Solomon; Sixty mighty men around it, of the mighty men of Israel. All of them are wielders of the sword, experts in war; Each man has his sword at his side, guarding against the terrors of the night." King Solomon has made for himself a sedan chair from the timber of Lebanon. He made its posts of silver, its back of gold and its seat of purple fabric, with its interior lovingly fitted out by the daughters of Jerusalem.

¹¹Go forth, O daughters of Zion, and gaze on King Solomon with the crown with which his mother has crowned him on the day of his wedding, and on the day of his gladness of heart.

4How beautiful you are, my darling, how beautiful you are! Your eyes are like doves. You are altogether beautiful, my darling, and there is no blemish in you.

Discussion Questions

1.	What time period in future events does this passage in the Song of Songs refer to?
2.	What can those who know the Lord be sure of in this dangerous world?
3.	When the blood of Yeshua is over us, who sees it and what does that blood do for us?
4.	Song of Songs 4:1-7 and Ephesians 1:4 tell us something that should help us accept how we are to our bridegroom. Describe the message being spoken here.
5.	How does knowing that Jesus, your Bridegroom, regards you as beautiful, change negative feelings of rejection you may battle? Write a prayer to God concerning this correction in your view of yourself.
6.	Next, write a statement to yourself about your image in Yeshua's eyes.
7.	Lastly, write a statement to the enemy who comes to you in the messages you hear in your mind and spirit. Rabbi, in his teachings on Self Deliverance uses the phrase, "Satan get out of my head!" Pair this with Scripture. When these thoughts of self rejection enter your thoughts and begin to torment you, recite this statement to him. Watch the enemy flee from you.
