Main Points

- In order to drink the living water Yeshua promised, we first have to <u>repent.</u>

- In order for us to become whole in our identities, we need to stop looking for man to affirm us.
- The only way we can feel whole is when we know the affirmation of the Father.
- You can only be a true blessing to other people when you give them something you've first received yourself.

Discussion Questions

4. What does cannibalism have to do with this subject of affirmation? What is meant that is so distasteful? What should be looking for instead?

5. Why is it important that you receive before you are able to bless others? Regarding being a blessing, write about the deliverance you seek from God for your life. Which comes first, yourself, or your ministry? How are Mary and Martha a picture of this in Luke 10:38-42?
