Main Points

- True revelation comes by the Spirit, and it is a gift of God.
- To walk in freedom, we must learn to abide in our Knower.
- If we are going to walk in revelation that will set us free, we need to come to the place where we are in touch with our Knower.
- Primary Reasons Some Believe There is No God
 - 1. When people have been hurt in life, they claim there is no God as a way to get back at God.
 - 2. When people are so affected by their intellect, they lose track of their Knower.
- Amen is the English word for the Hebrew transliteration Ahmein. This comes from Emunah which means faith.
- Amen means a way to affirm something we believe.
- It is up to you and me to choose to love Him with our will. Then, we will enter into true, dynamic, living love.
- God does not disqualify you!

Discussion Questions

1. How does surface knowledge of the Word of God lead to “religion” rather than relationship? How does revelation set us free from religion? Where are you on this journey of freedom through revelation?
2. Describe the difference between knowing Him intellectually, and knowing Him through the Knower? Did Rabbi’s example help bring clarity to this concept? Write your thoughts about this and if you have had an experience with the witness of the Holy Spirit.
3. Rabbi offered two primary reasons why people decide not to believe in God’s existence: Emotional pain experienced and intellectual dependence. How do these things dampen the inner knowledge of God’s presence? How does knowing this help you understand and have mercy for others who don’t embrace God?
4. The yielding of our will to love God is up to us. Write about the journey of transformation, the process of becoming what God wants us to be. How did Rabbi relate this back to the story of creation in Genesis?
5. What did Rabbi mean when he stated God needs us? What are some take aways for you from this episode, and if you have viewed them all, this series? What is in your heart to say to Him today?
