Scripture

- **Exodus 3:14-15**

God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM". He said, "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you.'" God, furthermore, said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the sons of Israel, 'The LORD.'" [Yahweh], the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. This is My name forever, and this is My memorial-name to all generations."

Main Points

- The Lord's Name in Hebrew is Yahweh.
- Moses Maimonides-Jewish Rabbi who coded the 13 precepts of Judaism.
- LORD is YHWH or Yud Hei Vov Hei (Yahweh)
- Shtayim, Shalosh, Sha-Ger is Hebrew for Two, Three, Launch
- Yahweh is the God and Father of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Because you are in relationship with Yahweh through Jesus, the same things promised in the Torah are for you today.
- We are in a relationship not just with a God but with a person.
- Yahweh can be grieved.
- God made us because He wanted someone to be in a love relationship with.

Discussion Questions

1. What do Isaiah and John and the angels tell us about how our experience with God will be in heaven? Write about where you are right now with Him and what meeting Him face to face means to you. Are you ready to experience emanations of our God's glory?
2. Why does Rabbi teach that God is a sensitive and real person we can know and not just as God, the Almighty and creating God?
3. Provide scriptural proof of this? How does this affect you?
4. How does the picture of a marriage relationship mirror our relationship with God? How is spiritual adultery committed?
5. Do we have the power to hurt God? How so? How does this possibility impact you in your relationship with Him?
