

Key Points



It was really the jealousy of the Pharisees and Chief Priests that led to the separation of Judaism and Christianity.



The Pharisees and Chief Priests feared Jesus—having performed miracles and spoken with authority in the Temple—would take away their power both religiously and politically.

Why did they fear losing their nation to Jesus?	

When the Temple was destroyed, what happened to Biblical Judaism?
The resulting system put in place by the Pharisees in 90 AD was born from the sons—grandsons of the very Pharisees who rejected Jesus' claims and miracle working power. Rejection of Jesus has been passed on in Judaism from generation to generation without
