Key Points

→ Traditional Jews do not believe in the Trinity (Deut 6:4-9)—the mystery of one God being manifest in the three distinct but relational beings of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—as Christians do.

But, scripture (including passages from the Old Testament) support this relationship of God the Father and the Son: See Gen.1:26, 2:24, 18:1; Daniel 7:13–14; John 1:1–3.

→ Christians should understand that the mother of our faith is Judaism. And, as Jesus said in John 4:22, “salvation is from the Jews.”
