Main Points

- Mitzvot is the Hebrew transliteration of the English word Commandments.
- Do Old Testament Jewish laws have application for New Testament believers?
- We are not under the law, but God reveals Himself to us through the law.
- The problem was not with the law, but with humanity being unable to keep the law,
- When we use the word "but" we are setting up an opposite.

- Yeshua is the incarnation of grace.
- There are 613 Jewish laws including:

 - 365 negative commandments coinciding with the days in a solar year.
 247 positive commandments that coincide with he bones and main organs of the human body.
