Revelation Decoded: Season 2

Core Message: This teaching focuses on the prophetic significance of the days of Noah and Lot as described in Scripture, highlighting their parallels with the moral and spiritual state of today's world. Rabbi Schneider warns that Yeshua's return is imminent and urges believers to examine their lives, live wholeheartedly for God, and be spiritually prepared. He emphasizes that God is emotionally moved by human corruption and desires a holy, faithful people. The world is ripe for judgment, and just as in Noah's and Lot's time, God will soon cleanse the earth to establish His kingdom.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

- **Core Memory Verse: (Matthew 24:37) "For the coming of the Son of Man will be just like the days of Noah."**
 - (Genesis 6:5-6) "Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of mankind was great on the earth... The LORD was sorry that He had made mankind on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart."
 - (Genesis 6:11-13) "Now the earth was corrupt in the sight of God, and the earth was filled with violence... Then God said to Noah, 'The end of humanity has come before Me... I am about to destroy them with the earth.'"
 - (Revelation 2:21-22) "I gave her time to repent, and she does not want to repent of her sexual immorality. Behold, I will throw her on a bed of sickness..."
 - (Luke 17:28-30) "It was the same as happened in the days of Lot... on the day that Lot left Sodom, it rained fire and brimstone from heaven and destroyed them all. It will be just the same on the day that the Son of Man is revealed."
