Jesus' Radical Rules

The Sermon on the Mount, Season 1

Core Message: Jesus calls His followers to live generously, love unconditionally, and seek God's approval over man's praise. Through the Sermon on the Mount, we are taught to reflect God's goodness by loving our enemies, giving without expecting return, and practicing righteousness in humility. Yeshua emphasizes the transformation of character that aligns us with the heart of our Heavenly Father—a life marked by spiritual strength, inner purity, and authentic devotion. Ultimately, our calling is to rise above natural responses and embody the perfection of our Father in Heaven through daily actions and attitudes.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

- Core Memory Verse: (Matthew 5:42) "Give to him who asks of you, and do not turn away from him who wants to borrow from you."
- (2 Thessalonians 3:10) "If anyone is not willing to work, then he is not to eat, either."
- (Matthew 5:44-45) "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may prove yourselves to be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous."
- (Matthew 5:48) "Therefore you shall be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect."
- Matthew 6:1) "Beware of practicing your righteousness before men to be noticed by them; otherwise, you have no reward with your Father who is in heaven."
- (Matthew 6:3-4) "But when you give to the poor, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your charitable giving will be in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you."

• Matthew 6:6) "But as for you, when you pray, go into your inner room, close your door, and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you."
