

These Choices Shape Your Eternal Destiny

Mysteries in the Gospel of John Season 10

Core Message: As Rabbi continues his teaching in the Gospel of John, he illuminates the life-transforming truth that Jesus (Yeshua) is the only door to salvation. Our eternity depends on whether one enters through the narrow gate of Yeshua. Rabbi Schneider unpacks the spiritual implications of John 10, urging viewers to evaluate the trajectory of their lives—whether toward life or darkness. Through obedience, sacrificial love, and discernment, believers deepen their walk with God and escape the dangers of spiritual stagnation.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

- **Core Memory Verse:** (John 10:9) **"I am the door; if anyone enters through Me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture."**
- (Psalm 23:2) "He lets me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside quiet waters."
- (John 10:10) "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came so that they would have life and have it abundantly."
- (John 10:14) "I am the good shepherd, and I know My own, and My own know Me."
- (John 10:26-27) "But you do not believe, because you are not of My sheep. My sheep listen to My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me."
- (Deuteronomy 30:19) "I have placed before you life and death, the blessing and the curse. So, choose life in order that you may live, you and your descendants."
- (Matthew 7:13-14) "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it. For the gate is narrow and the way is constricted that leads to life, and there are few who find it."
