

How To Walk in Perfect Faith

Lessons From the Lord's Brother Season 1

Core Message: In this episode, Rabbi Schneider teaches from the book of James about the importance and power of divine wisdom and unwavering faith. He emphasizes that wisdom is more than intellectual knowledge—it's a gift from God that helps us navigate life with discernment and understanding. Rabbi challenges believers to ask God for wisdom with full faith, resisting doubt and instability. He also calls for humility and equal love toward all people, regardless of status. The teaching highlights God's faithfulness to mature us in trust and guide us with His wisdom when we seek Him sincerely.

- **Core Memory Verse: (James 1:5)** "But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him."
 - **James 1:6–8** "But he must ask in faith, without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, being a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways."
 - **James 1:9–10** "But the brother of humble circumstances is to glory in his high position, and the rich man is to glory in his humiliation, because like flowering grass he will pass away."
 - **Proverbs 4:7** "The beginning of wisdom is: Acquire wisdom; and with all your possessions, acquire understanding."
