Their Ancient Rejection, is Your Modern Truth

Mysteries in the Gospel of John Season 11

Core Message: This teaching explores the deep-rooted spiritual and historical reasons behind the Jewish rejection of Jesus as the Messiah. Rabbi Schneider reveals that much of the resistance stems from the religious leaders of Yeshua's time, who feared losing their power and influence. Their decision to eliminate Jesus was not based on truth or scriptural contradiction, but on insecurity and pride. This mindset has been passed down through generations, creating a veil over the eyes of many Jewish people today. The teaching emphasizes the importance of understanding this history and proclaiming Jesus lovingly to Israel first.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

Core Memory Verse: John 11:47-48 – "Therefore the chief priests and the Pharisees convened a council, and were saying, 'What are we doing? For this man is performing many signs. If we let Him go on like this, all men will believe in Him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation."

- **John 11:49-50** "But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, 'You know nothing at all, nor do you take into account that it is expedient for you that one man die for the people, and that the whole nation not perish.'"
- **John 11:51-52** "Now he did not say this on his own initiative, but being high priest that year, he prophesied that Jesus was going to die for the nation, and not for the nation only, but in order that He might also gather together into one the children of God who are scattered abroad."
- John 11:53 "So from that day on they planned together to kill Him."
- Isaiah 53:6 "All of us, like sheep, have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the Lord has caused the wrongdoing of us all To fall on Him."
