

The Key to End-Time Revival... And Your Role in It

Core Message: This teaching reveals the often-overlooked truth that Paul's letter to the Romans centers on God's heart for Israel. While commonly used to explain individual salvation, Romans 9–11 show that Paul wrote with deep grief and burden for the Jewish people to recognize Yeshua as Messiah. God's covenant with Israel remains intact, and their future salvation is pivotal to His redemptive plan. Believers are called not only to personal faith but also to actively engage in bringing the Gospel to Jewish people, understanding that their acceptance of Messiah is tied to the return of Jesus and the fulfillment of God's kingdom on earth.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

Core Memory Verse: (Romans 9:1-4) "I am telling the truth in Christ, I am not lying; my conscience testifies with me in the Holy Spirit, that I have great sorrow and unceasing grief in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed, separated from Christ for the sake of my countrymen, my kinsmen according to the flesh, who are Israelites, to whom belongs the adoption as sons and daughters, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the Law, the temple service, and the promises."

- **Romans 10:1-4:** "Brothers and sisters, my heart's desire and my prayer to God for them is for their salvation. For I testify about them that they have a zeal for God, but not in accordance with knowledge. For not knowing about God's righteousness and seeking to establish their own, they did not subject themselves to the righteousness of God. For Christ is the end of the Law for righteousness to everyone who believes."
- **Romans 11:1-2:** "I say then, God has not rejected His people, has He? Far from it! For I too am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, of the tribe of Benjamin. God has not rejected His people whom He foreknew."
- **Romans 11:11:** "I say then, they did not stumble so as to fall, did they? Far from it! But by their wrongdoing salvation has come to the Gentiles, to make them jealous."

Reflection Questions:

1. What is your current understanding of God's plan for Israel, and how does this teaching challenge or confirm it?

2. Are there any beliefs you've held that align with replacement theology? How does Scripture refute that view?

3. What does Paul's burden for his people teach you about loving others enough to pray and act for their salvation?

4, What is God challenging you personally to do to support God's mission to bring salvation to the Jewish people?

5. Does the return of Jesus for us being tied to the return of the Jews to Him motivate you to be involved in sharing Yeshua with them?

Application Challenge of the Week:

Application Challenge of the Week: This week, take 15 minutes to pray specifically for the salvation of the Jewish people and ask God how He might use you to share the Gospel with them in love.

Prayer Prompts:

- Pray for Jewish people worldwide to have their hearts opened to Yeshua.
- Thank God for His unchanging covenant with Israel.
- Ask God to give you a burden and boldness like Paul to share His truth.
