

The Lamb and Your New Life

Passover and the Power of Deliverance

Core Message: Passover reveals Yeshua as the Lamb of God who came to deliver us from sin and its consequences. Just as God came down to rescue Israel from Egypt, He has come to rescue us from fear, shame, blame, and separation caused by sin. In examining Adam and Eve's fall, Rabbi helps us see that sin not only brings guilt but also robs us of God-consciousness, replacing it with fear and self-consciousness. Through confession and personal responsibility, we step into the freedom purchased by the blood of the Lamb. This season calls us to honest repentance so we can walk in greater love, confidence, and spiritual liberty.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

Core Memory Verse: (John 1:29) "The next day he saw Jesus coming to him and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!'"

- **(Exodus 3:8)** "So I have come down to deliver them from the power of the Egyptians, and to bring them up from that land to a good and spacious land, to a land flowing with milk and honey..."
- **(Genesis 3:9-10)** "Then the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?' He said, 'I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself.'"
- **(Matthew 1:21)** "She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."
- **(1 John 4:18)** "There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves punishment, and the one who fears is not perfected in love."
- **(1 John 1:9)** "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."
