

# The Jewish People Knew Jesus Was Coming

## Mysteries in the Gospel of John Season 12

---

**Core Message** In this teaching, Rabbi Schneider reveals how Yeshua (Jesus) fulfilled key Messianic prophecies during His triumphal entry into Jerusalem, aligning perfectly with Old Testament Scriptures. The crowds recognized Him as the promised King, crying out in prophetic praise. Rabbi emphasizes that God still confirms His Word today with signs and wonders, just as He did in the ministry of Jesus and the early church. The supernatural nature of God continues to be at work in the lives of believers, and we are encouraged to expect and believe in His miracle-working power.

### Main Bible Verses (NASB):

**Core Memory Verse: (John 12:21)** “These men came to Philip... and began to ask him, saying, ‘Sir, we wish to see Jesus.’”

- **(John 1:29)** “The next day he saw Jesus coming to him and said, ‘Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!’”
- **(John 12:12–13)** “On the next day the large crowd who had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took the branches of the palm trees and went out to meet Him, and began to shout, ‘Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel.’”
- **(Psalm 118:26)** “Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord; We have blessed you from the house of the Lord.”
- **(John 12:14–15)** “Jesus, finding a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written: ‘Do not fear, daughter of Zion; behold, your King is coming, seated on a donkey’s colt.’”
- **(Zechariah 9:9)** “Rejoice greatly, daughter of Zion! Shout in triumph, daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; He is righteous and endowed with salvation, humble, and mounted on a donkey, even on a colt, the foal of a donkey.”
- **(John 12:17–19)** “So the people, who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead, continued to testify about Him... the world has gone after Him!”
- **(1 Corinthians 5:7)** “Clean out the old leaven so that you may be a new lump, just as you are in fact unleavened. For Christ our Passover also has been sacrificed.”
