

One Light in God's House

The Mystery of the Tabernacle Season 1

Core Message: The teaching centers on the tabernacle as a prophetic blueprint for intimacy with God as a prophetic shadow of the spiritual world. Rabbi Schneider explains that the golden menorah represents the Holy Spirit, who is the believer's true source of light, wisdom, and revelation. Just as the priest in the holy place could not rely on natural light, believers must learn to depend on the Spirit rather than the world's false lights. This requires separation, stillness, and intentional time alone with God. The message calls us to develop an intimate relationship with God by His Spirit and to cultivate sensitivity to the Ruach Hakodesh so we can walk in obedience, discernment, and deeper fellowship with the Lord.

Main Bible Verses (NASB):

- **Core Memory Verse: (Exodus 25:8)** “Have them construct a sanctuary for Me, that I may dwell among them.”
- **(Revelation 1:4)** John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace, from Him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven Spirits who are before His throne,
- **(2 Corinthians 11:14)** No wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light.
- **(Acts 2:17)** "and it shall be in the last days; God says, ‘that I will pour out My Spirit on all mankind; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.’”
- **(Romans 8:14)** “For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons and daughters of God.”
- **(Colossians 1:27)** “to whom God willed to make known what the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles is, the mystery that is Christ in you, the hope of glory.”
- **(Psalm 46:10)** “Cease striving and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth.”
